

**Approval PTA Council Resolution
September 10, 2015
RCS Administration Building, Harrison Room**

A special meeting was held during the Rochester Community Schools PTA Council Leadership Day Training Session for the purpose of presenting a Resolution Endorsing 2015 Rochester Community Schools Bond. It was made clear this resolution applies to the Rochester Community Schools PTA Council, and it does not legislate for the local PTA school units.

The following Resolution was read by Samantha Phillips:

Resolution Endorsing 2015 Rochester Community Schools Bond

WHEREAS Rochester Community Schools PTA Council has consistently supported the children of Rochester Community Schools;

WHEREAS failure of legislation to adequately fund schools, has created a problem for local districts trying to attain the highest level of education.

WHEREAS passage of the 2015 school bond proposal would provide the funding for the erecting, furnishing and equipping additions to and partially remodeling, furnishing and refurbishing, equipping and re-equipping school facilities; acquiring, installing and equipping instructional technology for school facilities; constructing, equipping, developing and improving athletic and physical education facilities, playing fields and playgrounds; purchasing school buses; and developing and improving sites that would be a reflection of and a resource for the

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Rochester Community Schools PTA Council supports the passage of a \$185 million school bond, a ZERO tax increase, that will appear on the upcoming ballot on November 3rd, 2015.

The floor was opened to discussion, and the following people presented comments: Wendy Barthelemy, Amy DiCresce, Lisa Kowalski, and Marlena Radabaugh.

Representatives were present from all schools in the Rochester Community Schools district. The representatives agreed to a voice vote.

The members unanimously approved the Resolution.

Quorum was present. *Per the Rochester PTA Council Bylaws Approved in 2013; a quorum for the transaction of business shall consist of at least two officers and one delegate from a majority of the member PTA/PTSAs.*
